

MFL Learning Intentions

French Curriculum

Year 1 (Non-Statutory)

- Pupils will learn how to say simple greetings such as hello and goodbye.

- Pupils will learn how to say different colours such as red, yellow, blue, brown, green, pink, orange, brown, black and white.
- Pupils will learn how to tell someone how old they are and then ask a friend how old they are.
- Pupils will learn how to say the days of the week.
- Pupils will learn how to talk about different types of weather.
- Pupils will learn to appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language.
- Pupils will learn how to say simple greetings such as Happy Birthday, Happy Christmas and Happy Easter.

Year 3 (Statutory)

- **Pupils will** broaden their vocabulary and develop their ability to understand new words that are introduced into familiar written material, including through using a dictionary.
- **Pupils will learn to** write phrases from memory and adapt these to create new sentences to express ideas clearly.
- **Pupils will begin to** understand basic grammar appropriate to the language being studied, including (where relevant): feminine, masculine and neuter forms and the conjugation of high-frequency verbs; key features and patterns of the language; how to apply these, for instance, to build sentences; and how these differ from or are similar to English.
- Pupils will learn to develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases.
- Pupils will begin to engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others and seek clarification and help.
