Background:

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and sport. The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools with 17 or more eligible pupils receive £16,000 and an additional payment of £10 per pupil. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in years 1 to 6. In most cases, this has been determined by how many pupils a school had using data from the January 2019 school census. The funding is for the period is September 2019 to August 2020. This funding is ring fenced to be used for sport specific areas to make an impact in Physical Education and Sport in schools. Schools are free to determine how best to use this funding to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision, including increasing participation in PE and Sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.

During the academic year September 2019 to August 2020 we plan to spend our funding in the following areas:

Provision of qualified Sports Coaches for two days a week £11,020. Our sports coach works alongside teachers, supporting their lessons to build their professional development and their ability to teach PE. Also, they ensure each child receives 2 hours of quality PE teaching per week, introducing a range of new sports to our school.

We have updated our sports equipment at a cost of £1,450.

Through the Witchford sports partnership, they will be coming in to teach a range of non-traditional sports days to groups of chn. The intended outcomes of this are that more chn find something which they enjoy doing that will help to improve over fitness and skills, whilst also allowing us to upskill teachers so they feel confident to teach this to future year groups, thereby creating a legacy of this funding.

Park Lane intend to build and maintain links with local professional clubs. The intention of this is to encourage chn to partake in a range of sports thereby improving their overall fitness and skills set. Also by inviting professional athletes into the school we hope to motivate and educate the chn so they know how and what to expect to be a top sportsperson. Over time we aim to keep these links, which means the legacy will be guaranteed

Finally we aim to keep some of the money in reserve. This allows us to introduce cutting edge sports schemes/ ideas as and when they are launched to improve the overall provision and delivery of PE in the school.
